

Endoscopy Report





Hospital: Dr Paws Hospital

Patient Information:

Species: Canine

Referral: The patient was referred from Elite Vet Centre for endoscopy.

Case History: Bungo was presented with a history of foreign body ingestion. The owner reported ingestion of a blanket. Clinical signs included retching.

Procedure: An upper gastrointestinal endoscopy was performed under general anesthesia using a flexible endoscope. The esophagus and stomach were thoroughly examined.

Findings:

- A large foreign body consistent with a piece of fabric (blanket) was identified within the stomach.
- The foreign material was occupying a significant portion of the gastric lumen.
- Moderate mucosal irritation was observed alongside the esophagus.

Intervention:

Endoscopic retrieval of the foreign body was attempted using grasping forceps. The foreign body was successfully removed endoscopically.

Post-Procedure Assessment: The patient recovered uneventfully from anesthesia but an echocardiogram is recommended as soon as possible.

Recommendations:

- Monitor for vomiting, anorexia, or abdominal discomfort
- Administer gastroprotective therapy as indicated
- Soft diet for 2–3 days
- Anti-inflammatory injection
- Anti-emetic and gastroprotectant injections
- Synalox injection

Prognosis: Good, if the foreign body was completely removed.
